### **Statement of Financial Position & Statement of Activity**

Net income for the month of September was (\$12,988). Expenses incurred were primarily for memberships, software and Manitou23 grant expenses. Interest income in the amount of \$831 is from the Foundation's money market and certificates of deposit accounts.

### **Accounts Receivable**

As of September 30, 2024, there was a total of \$90 due for the 2019 Fall Economic Forecast, \$140 for the 2022 Fall Economic Perspective, \$115 due for Spirit of Sonoma, \$80 due for the Spring Economic Conference, \$1,226 due for General Services' portion of the August & September CoStar subscription and \$14,700 due for sponsorships. \$4,726 was paid as of October 31<sup>st</sup>.

### **Accounts Payable**

As of September 30, 2024, there was \$17 due for meal expenses and \$60,476 due to the County of Sonoma for Hewlett Adapt & Manitou23 grant expenses.

**Notes**: Registration for this was lower than previous signature events. For comparison, 2023 Fall Economic Perspective registration was 319. Reasons attendance was lower than usual could potentially be due to:

Proximity to the holiday season. This event has never occurred this close to the holidays.

Election fatigue.
