Construction Industry Outreach

As part of the targeted outreach to local Construction Industry, Patti Andrews and Jack Kampmann created a

Construction Industry Workforce Development report (attached) designed for parents, students, career counselors, job seekers and local industry stakeholders. This comprehensive report covers key details about various construction trades, including earning potential, required skills or training, current job openings, top employers in the area and highlights the EDC's ongoing efforts to grow the local construction workforce, both now and in the future.

Local Immigration Integration and Inclusion Grant Program

The EDC applied for and received a Notice of Intent to Award Grant for Sonoma County in the amount of \$141,235.60 in grant funding to complete a comprehensive asset map and gap analysis of Sonoma County's

economic development and social service providers through intentional community engagement and partnership to help strengthen current services available to the regional immigrant population.



As part of the scope of the work for this grant, a survey

has been launched (attached) to collect information from local agencies to identify (1) services provided by individual organizations/agencies and (2) approximate geographic service areas for surveyed agencies. The information shared will offer insight into the current resources and gaps in service provision and will information the development of a future programs and initiatives designed to support immigrant integration across Sonoma County.








THIS ENTIRE FISCAL YEAR | MONTHLY COMPARED TO | LAST FISCAL YEAR FILTERS (2)







Avenues to Break into Construction

Apprenticeships 101

- Apprenticeships serve to Recruit and train individuals skilled in a specific trade. Apprentices will learn on the job and work while they learn. There are both union and non-union apprenticeship programs.
- The length of apprenticeship programs typically vary between 3 and 5 years. There are also informal training programs that can last a shorter duration.
- Many apprenticeships include a weekly or monthly class component
- You must be 18+ years old and possess a valid driver's license to become an apprentice.

Trade School

- Trade school offers students the ability to learn curriculum, develop proficiency for certain skills, and attain certifications to prepare them for work in the construction trades.
- Vocational trade schools offer an affordable education in a shorter duration of time. Generally, students can obtain Associate's Degrees in two years or take the classes and certifications they want without a degree.
