

Economic Development Collaborative Creative Sonoma Update May 2025

ADMINISTRATION

Hiring

Creative Sonoma is hiring a Program Officer! This role will strategize, design, and execute programs and services that align with Creative Sonoma's mission, fostering and promoting the creative community throughout Sonoma County. The position will manage the grant and capacity-building programs offered by Creative Sonoma, including grant-making, professional development, peer networks, and serve as a one-on-one consultant to creative individuals, nonprofits, and businesses. Applications were due 5/19.

Federal and State Cuts to Arts & Culture Funding

Federal funding cuts to the arts and humanities are concerning to the local arts community. Creative Sonoma has been sharing updates and resources, including actions you can take to respond. Current information is available through <u>CA Arts Advocates</u> and <u>Americans for the Arts</u>.

The latest CA budget revision includes a devastating cut to the arts by removing the \$11.5M for the Performing Arts Equitable Payroll Fund. Many performing arts non-profits have already applied for this funding and their applications are now in final CAL OSBA review. Pulling the funds at this stage would cancel hundreds of arts jobs, close venues and hurt local businesses that rely on performing arts audiences. As of 5/19, Creative Sonoma is aware of 8 local performing arts organizations who applied for this one-time payroll reimbursement program. Organizations are encouraged to contact their state representatives to urge them to add this funding back to the budget.

Teaching Artists Certificates

- Creative Sonoma is partnering with the Luther Burbank Center for the Arts to offer the <u>LBC</u>
 <u>Teaching Artist Certificate</u>. The certificate is designed to equip aspiring and current teaching
 artists with essential skills, strategies, and hands-on experience in arts education. Participants
 will engage in a series of workshops and a practicum that provides direct experience working
 alongside LBC's professional Teaching Artists. Participants who complete the program in full are
 eligible for an honorarium. The training begins in October 2025.
- Creative Sonoma is also promoting the <u>SRJC Arts Educator Assistant Certificate</u> that begins this fall. Prospective students are professional artists, teaching artists, 2nd career professionals, paraprofessionals, and others. Courses are CSU-transferrable.

Emerging Artist Incubator

SebArts Emerging Artist Incubator Program, funded by Creative Sonoma, is designed to empower and support talented emerging artists on their journey to establish themselves as successful and sustainable artists by providing professional development.
